There's no logical reason for a woman to give up her job and sell her home to settle elsewhere. Now, I have to leave my students, lifelong friends and family to start a new life, alone. 3- Once the plane landed in Utah, there were a thousand things to do. And, if my plan went as scheduled, I only had three months to get them done. At least 50 times a day, one of those things was just repeat to myself, "I'm going to Italy. To live!" It was at this point that I began to learn the first of many new life lessons.

4- Not everyone was going to be thrilled about my new adventure. Most were mildly surprised, but some were downright dream-squashers. There were a few people, however, that totally embraced my choice to go. Most of them older. All of them women. They knew how small the window of time can be for us to act on a dream. If doors opened and plans presented themselves, I knew I was headed in the right direction.

5- If it felt like I was pushing a boulder upstream, rather than going with the flow, I knew I had to change plans. October 2, 2012, I boarded the flight to Florence, Italy. Behind me: my son and daughter and a life never lived. Ahead of me: unknown. And all of that was just fine until the plane was about 3 hours over the Atlantic Ocean. There weren't any tears this time, just a sinking feeling that began at the base of my stomach, and moved to my throat.
