- Edouard Jozan attended one of the best secondary schools in Paris and graduated from the nation's ultra competitive elite engineering college. He's in his early 30's and he's ambitious. He has left France, in no hurry to return.
- 2) Edouard switched to a career in international finance and spent five years working in Germany after college before moving back to France only to get a shock. So he quickly left again, taking a career break to do an M.B.A (Master of Business and Administration) at the London Business School. He says he expects to stay there for work when he finishes. 'The quality of life in France is good' Edouard says, 'but if you are young and ambitious, I'm not sure it is always the right place that allows you to succeed."
- Bedouard is just one of an estimated 2.2 million French citizens about 4% of the population who have joined a wave of emigration. According to the Foreign Ministry, there has been a 40% increase in the number of those registering at French consulates abroad since 1995. People are leaving for all sorts of reasons, of course, ranging from greater opportunities to higher salaries. Two people leave France every day for tax reasons alone, according to a recent senate report. But for the most part, those leaving are not wealthy retirees tooking for a place in the sun; they are talented and ambitious young people in their 20's and 30's who have left because they felt they couldn't advance their career at home.
